We were able to keep her and her daughter from being evicted. They're now living safe and sound in their own apartment, and continue to receive financial and emotional support from ASC.

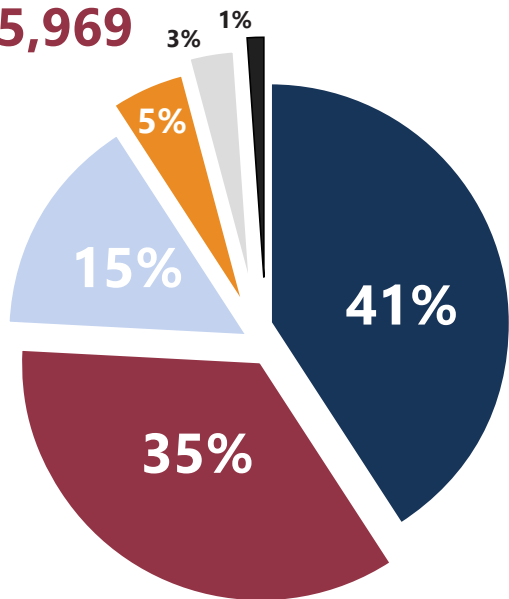

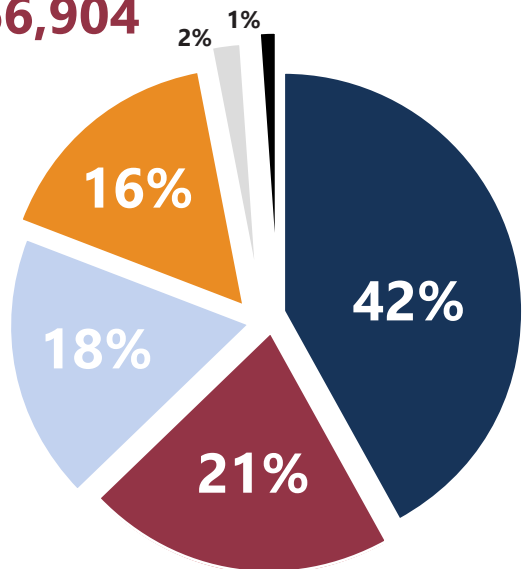
