Another year of growth has gone by with even more potential ahead. In the time since the onset of COVID-19, Atlantic Street Center - and most other community organizations - have had to drastically pivot again and again to compensate for a variety of losses. Recently, we have been fortunate to see the return of these said losses, specifically in-person events. Even with enhanced precautions, Atlantic Street Center has successfully been able to be a part of and curate community-centric events. These moments have allowed us to reconnect with participants and supporters in ways that we have been missing since March 2020.

In 2022, we were able to host our 21st Annual Juneteenth Celebration for the second time since the pandemic with an even bigger and more enthusiastic crowd than the year prior. This community staple is always a treat for our participants and the partners that join us. We also saw the return of our support groups gathering in-person to access resources and create strong connections with one another, including our Teen & Young Parents Program and the Kinship Care Support Group. The reach of our resources also expanded as seen with CoRe, our video game-based therapy program that is now available in three Seatte middle schools with more on the horizon.

Our annual gala officially returned to in-person this past October at the Renaissance Hotel in Downtown Seattle. We had the opportunity to connect with new faces as well as reminisce with those we had not seen for a while. For all of us, it was a confident nod towards the future in terms of raising awareness of Atlantic Street Center's services and the success of our participants.

There are still so many steps to climb, but we are all beginning to live a life where social services are yet again mostly in-person. Now that it is somewhat safer to gather together, Atlantic Street Center's reach can widen and create a larger impact here in King and Pierce Counties.

What happens next? Now that our community has truly seen what inequity looks like, we can be more intentional and efficient in how we make Greater Seattle a better place to live. For us, this means enhancing our emotional and physical connections with participants and their families day in and day out. We hope you will join us in cementing that initiative.

OUR PROGRAMS

Behavioral Health

Our experienced therapists work with participants ages 5-24 by utilizing evidence-based and culturally responsive approaches to guide them in navigating their mental health. We also manage an intern program giving behavioral health practicum students the opportunity to make a difference while expanding their education. Our newest mental health iniative is CoRe, our video game-based therapy program that is now utilized in three Seattle middle schools.

Early Learning

In partnership with the national organization ParentChild+ and its well-established curriculum, we are able to pair Early Learning Specialists with King County and Pierce County families that have children ages 16 - 48 months. Our Specialists visit family homes with free educational books and toys to help the child start their learning journey, as well as empower caregivers to be their child's first teacher.

Youth Development & Education Support


Through a variety of programs, we are able to serve family units in multiple facets. Our After-School program and Summer Academy gives youth a constructive place to do their home work, connect with staff and adult role models, and take part in communty-centric activities. We also host two support groups: teen/young parents and kinship caregivers. These groups provide community and resources to families and their unique needs.

Gender-Based Violence

Our Gender-Based Violence (GBV) advocacy group provides support through resource connections, housing assistance, and therapy resources. When survivors and their families experiene violence in the home, sexual exploitation, and/or financial abuse, our GBV team works endlessly to support them in moving forward safely.

Josie and her band also gave us an evening of music and dancing many of us had been missing. Before the night ended, we also awarded Olivia Aldridge of the former 19th & Jackson Starbucks with our Heart of the Community Award for her and her staff's dedication to our mission and programs during the height of the pandemic.

We succesfully raised \$180,000 with the help of genreous donors. It was incredible to be back at the Seattle Renaissance Hotel among our community thought leaders and local supporters. Connections were reignited, new goals were established, and friendships were cherished.

In our 114 years of service, we have never taken for granted the people we serve or those who choose to work alongside us. The isolation of the pandemic pushed our team to work harder than ever before with less resources at their finger tips. Having this gala validated for our team that our efforts have a large impact and there will always be a need for Atlantic Street Center. See you all in October 2023!




As always, we love being educated by the youth we serve. They are our future. We look forward to their accomplishments in 2023.



Age Demographics of Participants




Racial Demographics of Participants




