CRISIS TURNED SUCCESS

Finding housing is one of the toughest parts survivors of gender-based violence face when escaping. There is often red tape, iron-clad leases, and even a lack of beds in shelters. This has not stopped our Gender-Based



Violence (GBV) Support staff from doing their part to assist those in need.

A recent participant fled a violent situation, forcing them to live out of their car. Their bad credit made finding a new home challenging. Our GBV staff searched for eight months until they found a sympathetic landlord who looked past the bad credit and allowed our participant to move in before having to pay a deposit.

And thanks to additional funds (thank you!), the GBV team also assisted with moving costs. No longer is this survivor in their car. Instead, they are in a safe home they can be proud of!


In the week leading up to and on
