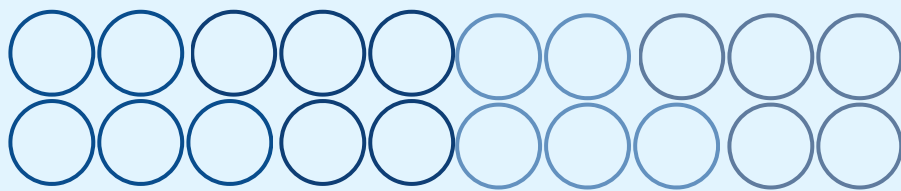

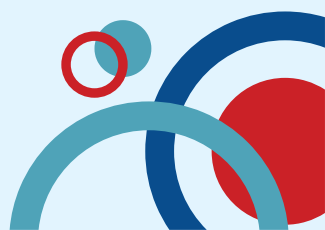
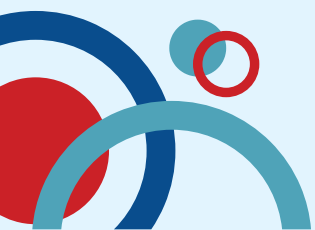




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A MESSAGE ON YEAR 2025

Our team and board continue to be creative and resourceful assets to the youth, children, and families we serve. Your support, donations, social media interactions, and volunteerism are crucial in making our initiatives possible and successful.

Celebrating our 115th birthday in 2025 was more than a celebration. **It was a milestone!** To be one of the longest-running youth and family service organizations in the region is not a legacy we take lightly. As an organization, we have seen the impacts of multiple pandemics, cultural shifts from the Civil Rights Movement, changes in federal and local government policies, and how significant community changes affect each and every home and family differently. IDENTITY & LEADERSHIP TEAM

OUR MISSION: Atlantic Street Center's mission to support families and communities with raising healthy, successful children and youth through direct services and advocacy for social justice and equity.

PROGRAMS

Behavioral Health – Culturally relevant mental health resources for young people, and their families, including access to therapists, medical case management, therapeutic gaming, and support groups.

Early Learning – Pairing families with Early Learning Specialists who provide in-home learning development. Specialists work with families through introductions to reading, numbers, and communication skills.

Gender-Based Violence – Supporting survivors of interpersonal relationship abuse (including domestic, verbal, financial, sexual, etc.). Survivors gain access to therapists, support in moving forward, guidance in finding safe housing, and personal safety planning.

Youth Development & Education Support – This program supports all young people and their families through year-round youth programming, and support groups and case management (kinship caregivers and teen parents). This program also hosts multiple events that encourage community-wide engagement.

Beloved Board Member Vice President-Elect (2026) and long-time supporter of Atlantic Street Center Stephen Deal passed away in January of 2026.

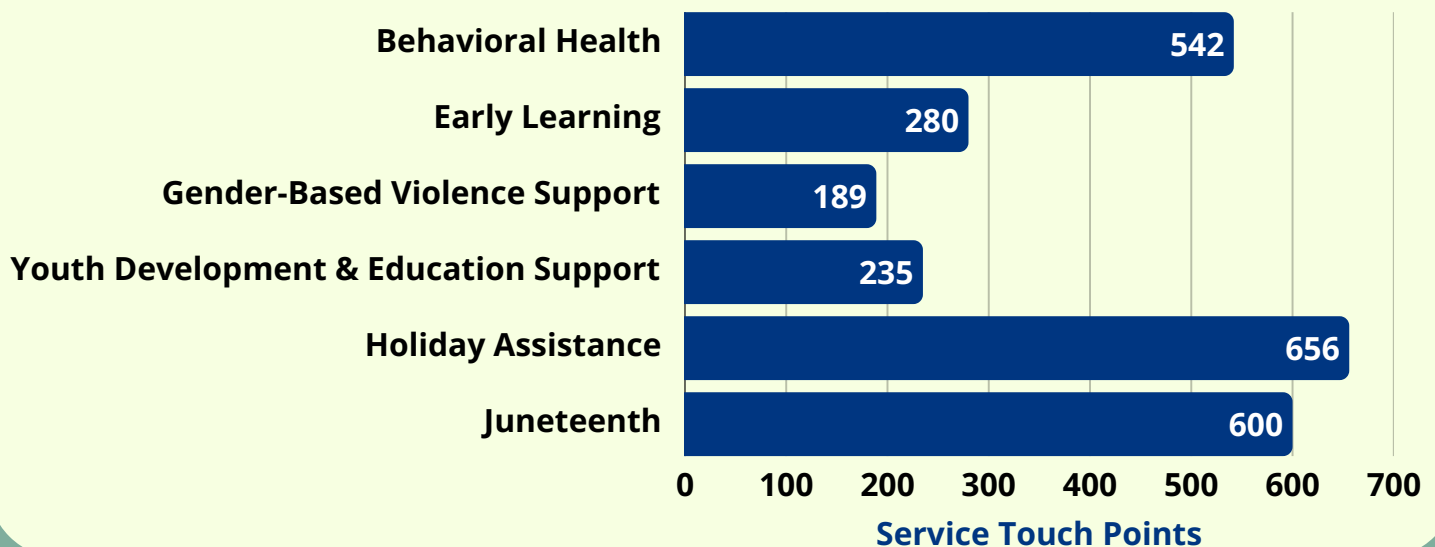

A YEAR IN REVIEW

Atlantic Street Center (ASC) supports participants through four major programs, plus two major community events. Participants can be enrolled in more than one ASC program at a time. Thus, we record our annual service numbers as “service touch points,” highlighting how often ASC is able to support people at any moment.

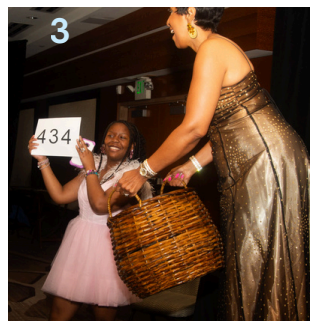

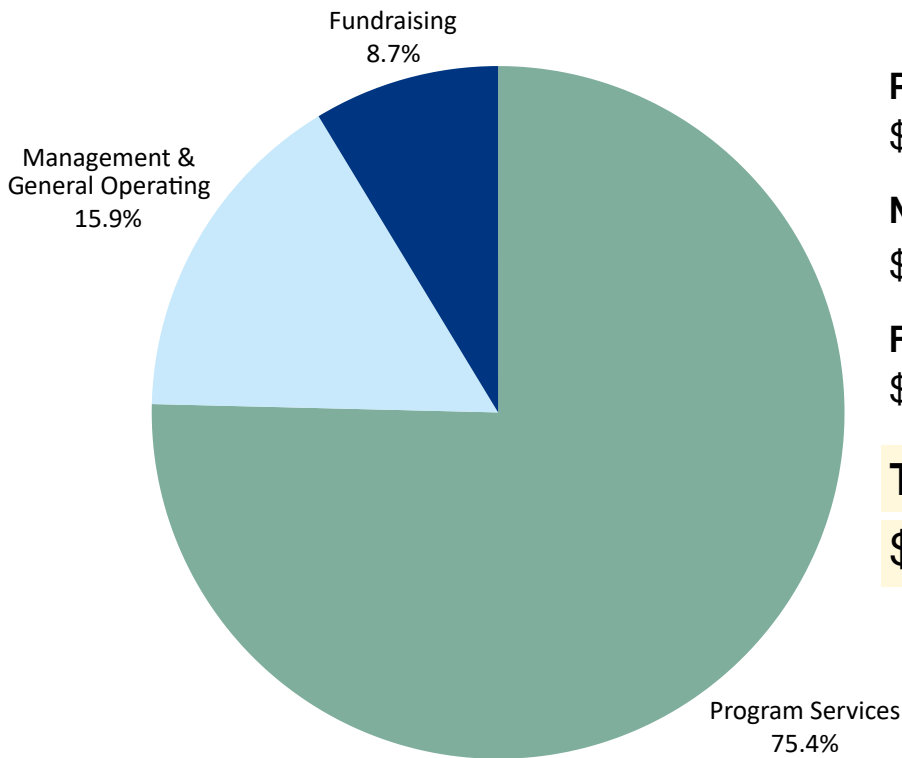

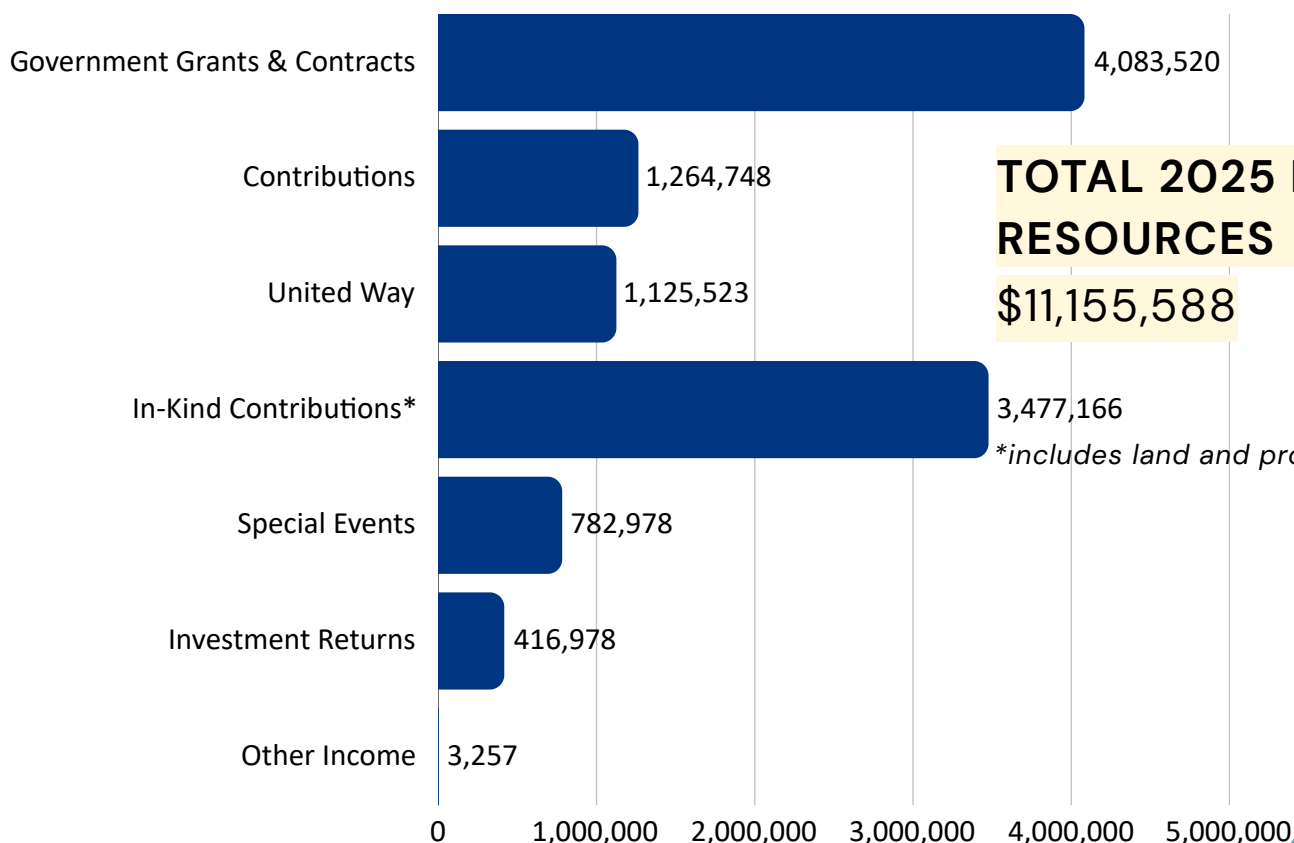
